1. Why Talk About Adoption

- b. Did this lesson make you feel more or less comfortable about talking about adoption with your child?

3. Developmental Stages

- a. How soon do you intend to begin telling your child about adoption?
- b. How do you think you will talk about adoption differently at different stages of your child's life?

4. Communication Strategies

- a. How important do you think it is to share your child's history with her? What worries you about telling your child the truth about her history?
- b. In this lesson you analyzed conversations between parents and their children about adoption.
 - i. Could you imagine having a similar conversation with your child some day? How might it be similar/different?

5. Communication Tools

- a. Do you plan to have family rituals around your child's adoption?
